Communication training

interact-ABI-lity communication training

This **communication training program** is for people who communicate with people with acquired brain injury. Acquired brain injury can include stroke, traumatic brain injury or a progressive neurological condition.

- interact-ABI-lity is online and is free. It takes about two hours to compete it. You can do the training at your own pace.
- Speech pathologists designed the training program.
- It is based on research evidence.
- People with acquired brain injury and clinicals helped us to design the training.

- There are videos of people with lived experience of communication difficulties after different types of brain injury.
- They have aphasia, dysarthria, cognitive-communication impairment or communicate without speech. They tell their stories and give advice on communication strategies.
- There are other videos and interactive tasks.
- You can get a **certificate of completion** if you finish the training.
